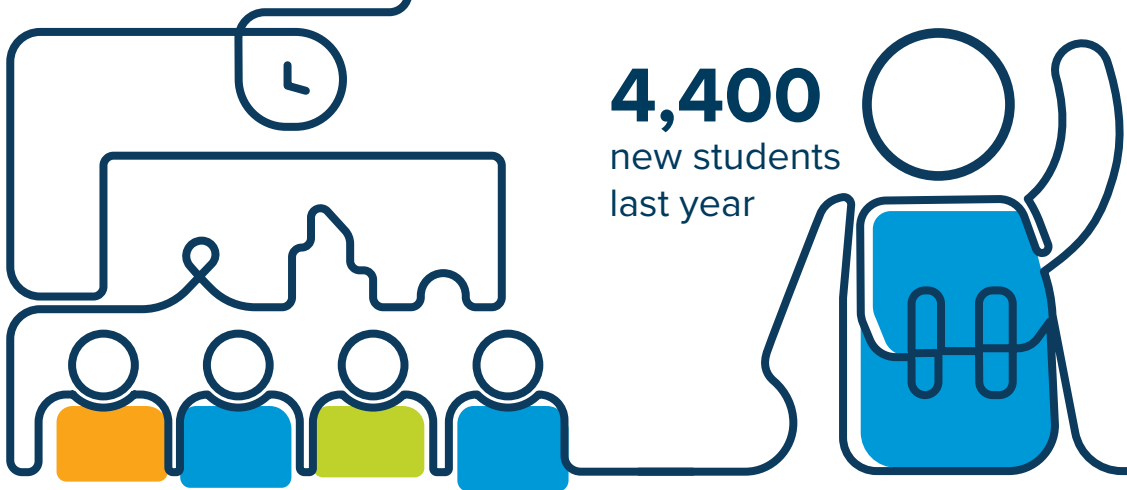

Getting good grades in high school?

Transfer students

Students with completed post-secondary courses from other institutions may be eligible to receive transfer credits. Identify all previous education when you apply by submitting current official transcripts from all previous institutions attended. You may be required to submit course outlines/syllabi for assessment. Transcripts will be evaluated once official documents have been received.

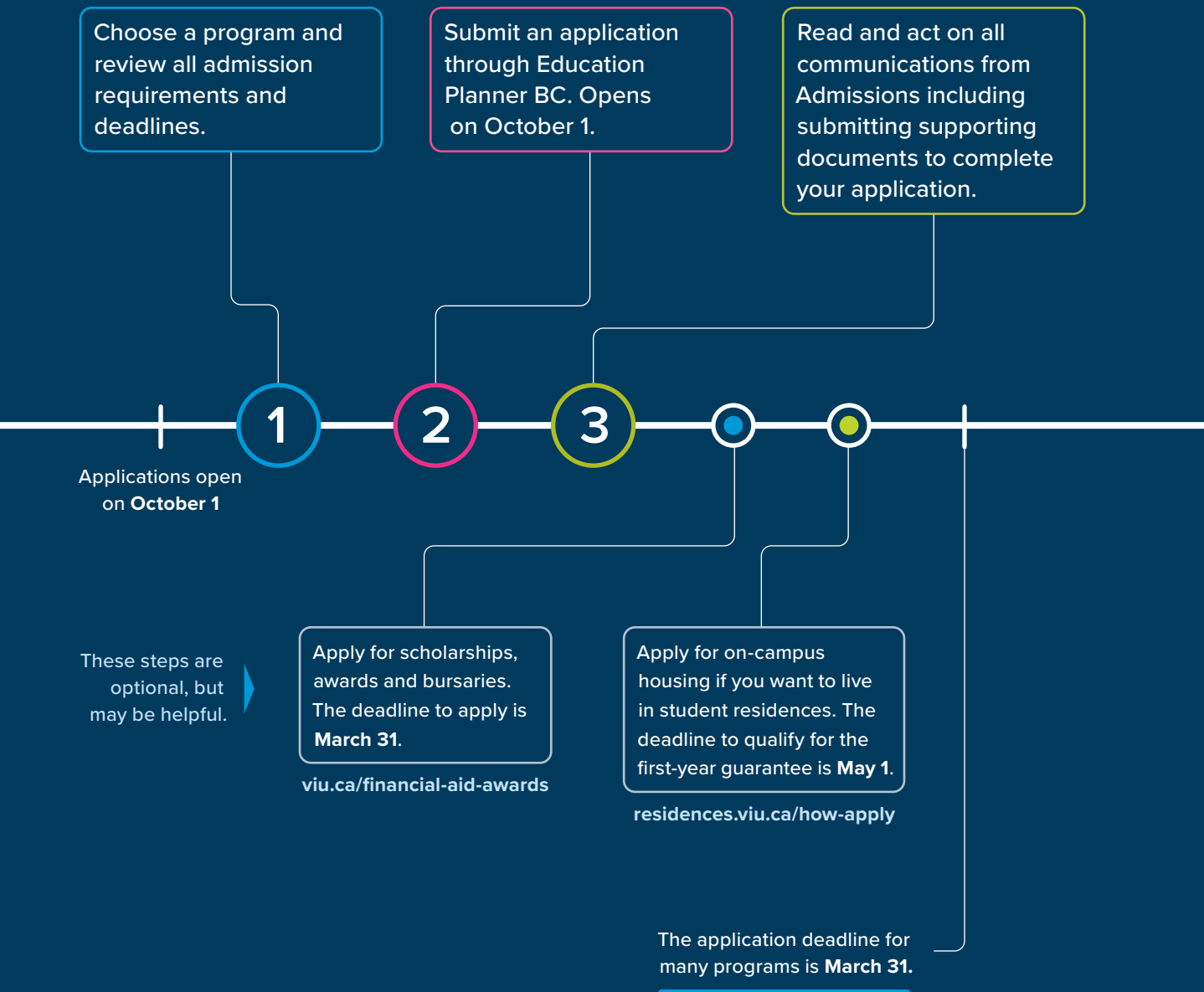

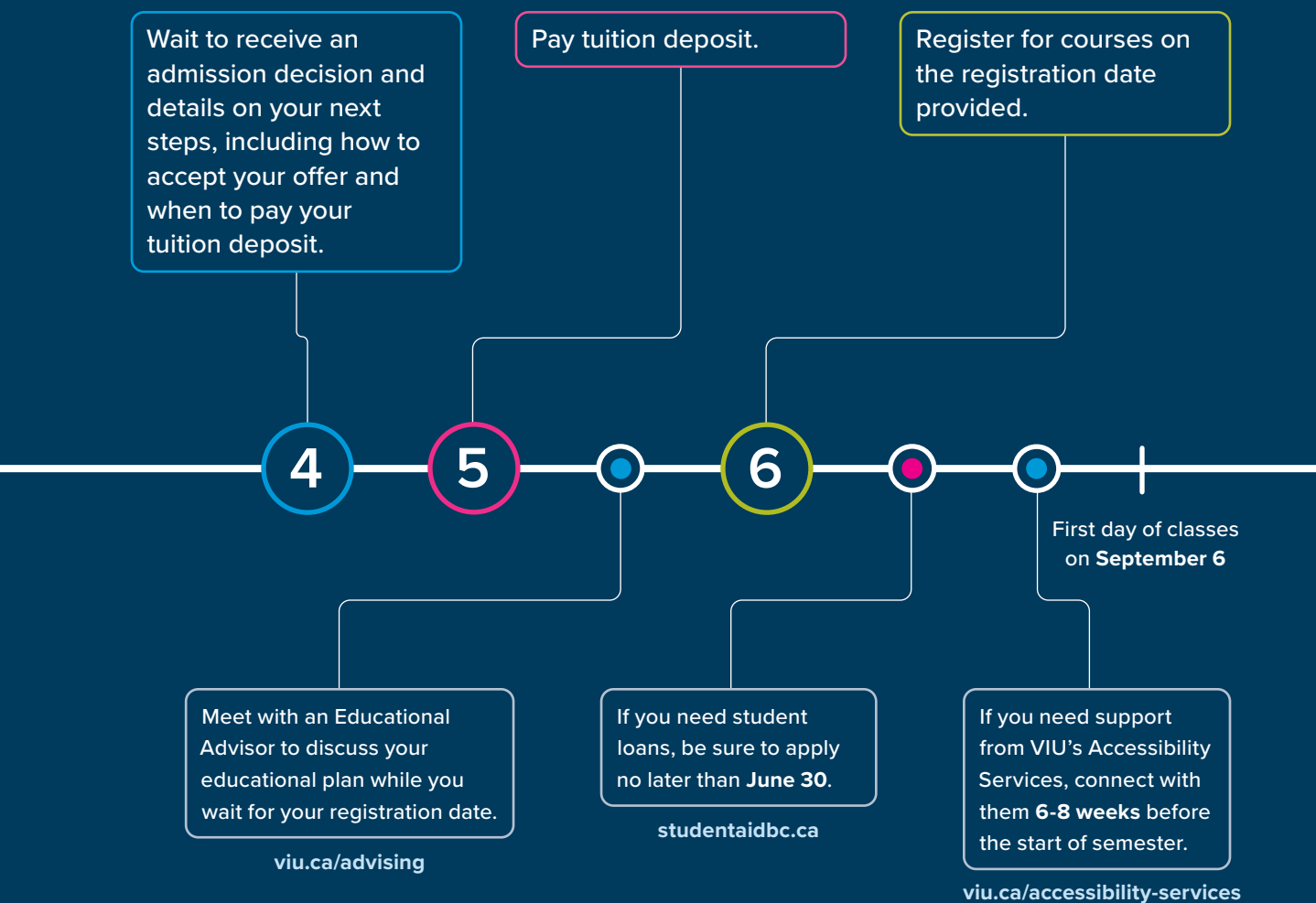

There are also a lot of options available to help you pay for university, and we have plenty of tips and support to help you manage your expenses and reduce costs.

There are many options that can help you pay for university studies

- Apply for student loans
- Apply for VIU scholarships, awards and bursaries
- Apply for external awards
- Work part-time while studying and during breaks from school
- Stick to a budget
- Share accommodation and transportation
- Buy used text books or look into renting them from the Campus Store
- Get free tuition if you are a student who has aged out of care
- Live in Student Housing at a reasonable rate

Scholarships, awards and bursaries

The Scholarship, Award and Bursary program provides financial assistance, incentives and rewards to eligible students to assist in their pursuit of post-secondary education.

Last year VIU awarded more than \$4.3 million with the average award size of about \$1,000.

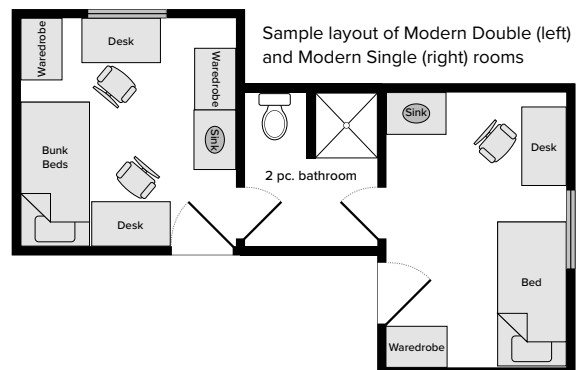
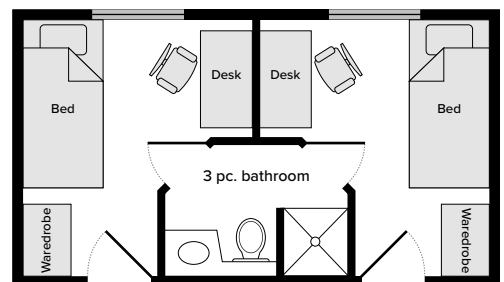
Dine at two cafeterias on campus with fast, convenient and flexible options. Meal plan options are available.

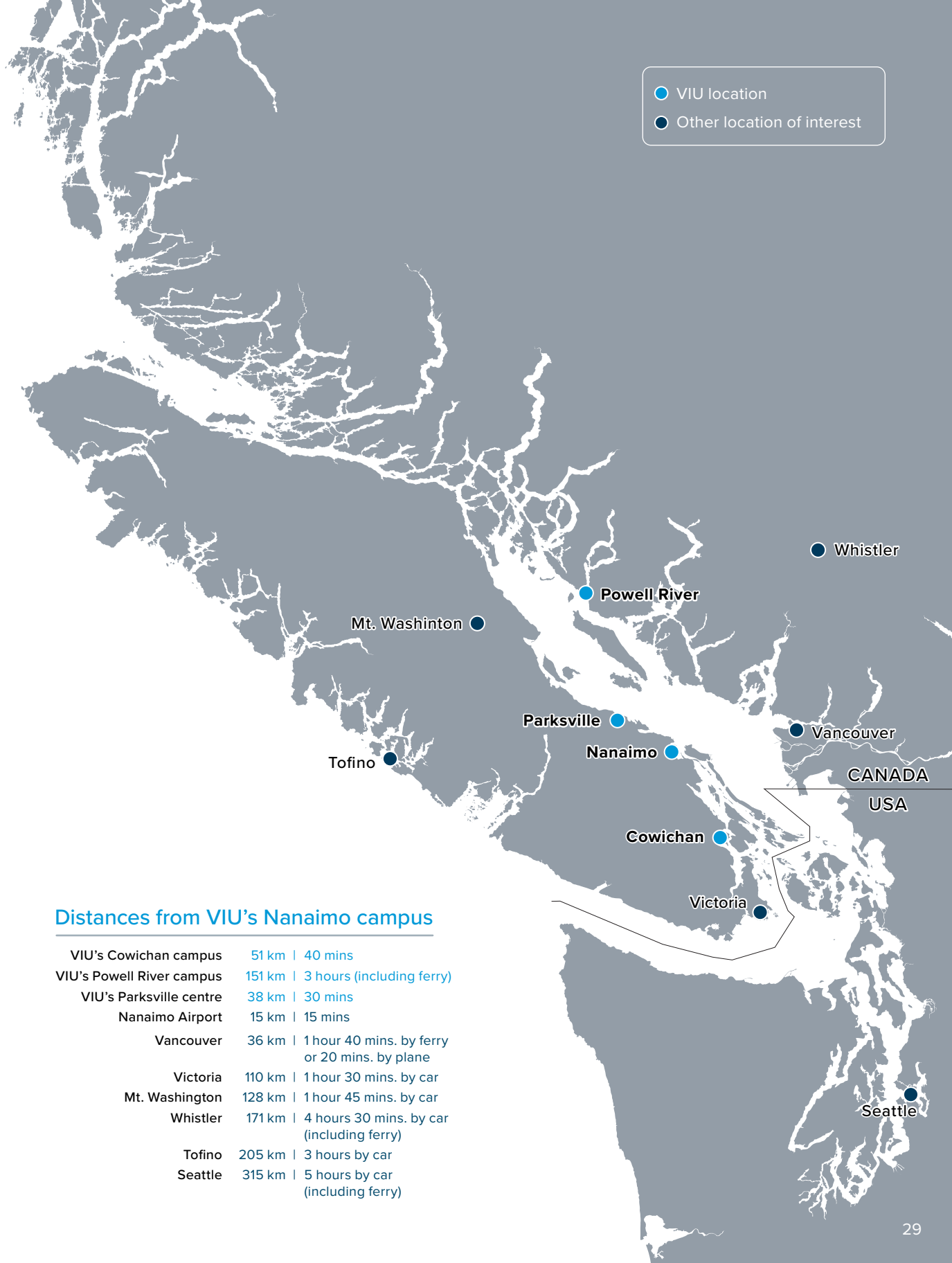
