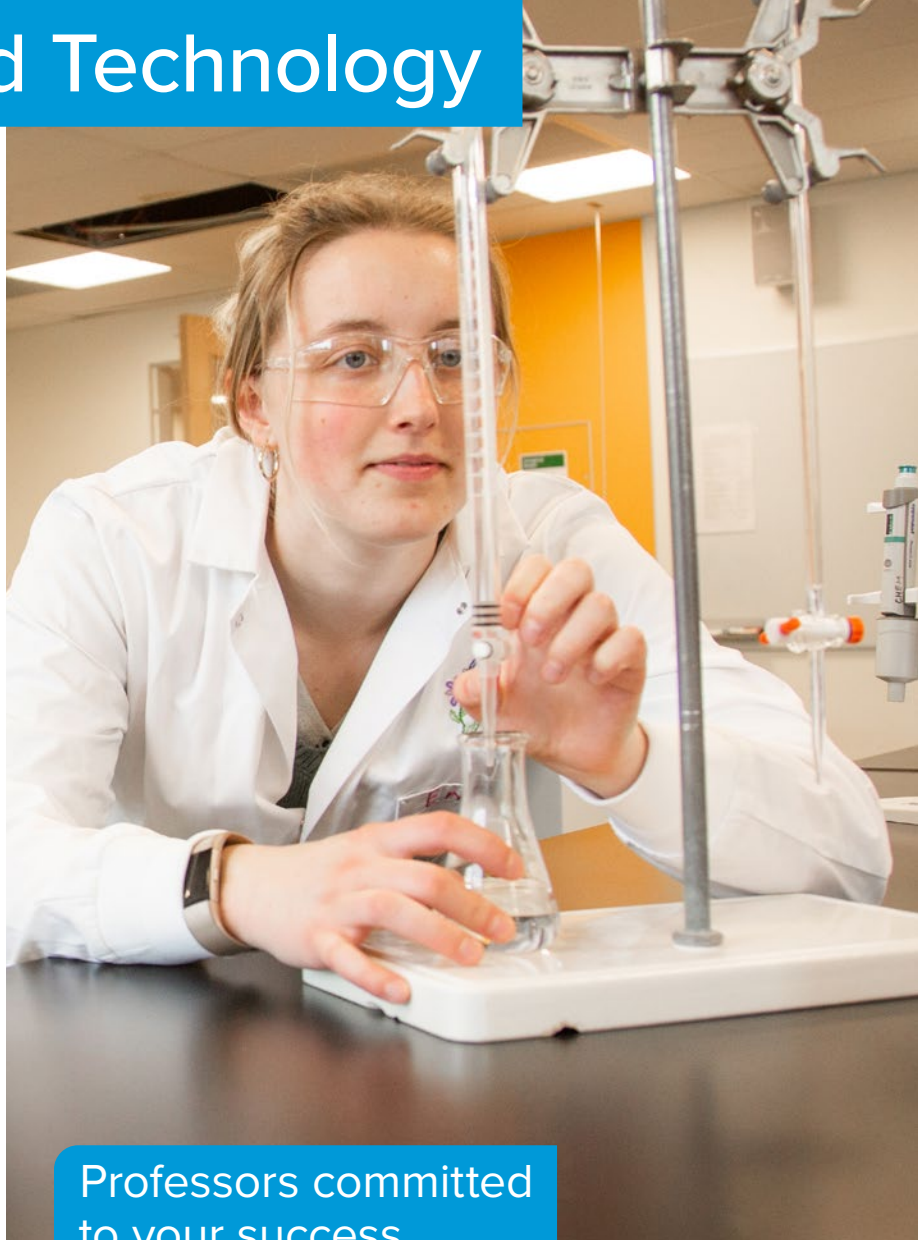

# Admissions information

## General admission requirements

- graduation from a BC secondary school or equivalent
- minimum “C” grade in either English Studies 12 or English First Peoples 12

## Bachelor of Science

- general admission requirements
- minimum “B” grade in either Pre-calculus 12 or Principles of Mathematics 12
- Some majors and minors require specific high school science courses.

## Bachelor of Business Administration

- general admission requirements
- Pre-Calculus 12 or Foundations of Mathematics 12 with a minimum “C” grade (or equivalent) or C+ in Pre-calculus 11 (or equivalent)
- Students with only Pre-Calculus 11 must upgrade with MATH 151 or MATH 065 during the first semester.

## Exploratory Studies

- general admission requirements

## Trades

- graduation from a BC secondary school, or equivalent
- If you’re 19 or older, or you’ll turn 19 in the first two months of the program, you can apply in the mature student category.

## International Baccalaureate and Advanced Placement Program

- higher level IB courses with grades of 5 or better, and/or APP courses with grades of 4 or better, may be eligible for introductory-level University course credit.
- A maximum of 30 credits will be awarded for IB/APP courses.

## Transfer students

If you have completed post-secondary courses at other institutions you may be eligible to receive transfer credits. Once you have applied, you will need to submit current official transcripts from all previous institutions you have attended. You may need to submit course outlines or syllabi for assessment. Transcripts will be evaluated once official documents have been received.

## Mature students

If you’re 21 or older you can enroll in university programs without high school completion.

## Upgrading options

VIU’s Adult Basic Education department offers equivalencies for English 12 or English 12 First Peoples. Assessment testing opportunities are also available.

## Free supports with Pathways

If you need to take Adult Basic Education (ABE) or English as a Second Language (ESL) courses to meet the entry requirements of a program, you may qualify for free supports. The Pathways to Post-Secondary Program will work with you to create an individualized learning plan that includes:

- coursework tailored to your goals
- academic support
- community

VIU awards \$3.5 million in entrance scholarships, awards and bursaries each year. And we offer a single application for these awards.



## First year priority

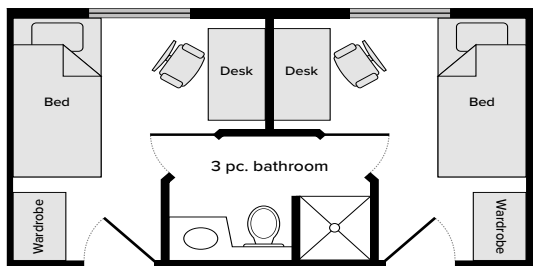
VIU prioritizes space in student housing for all first-year students. Apply by May 1 to qualify for priority.

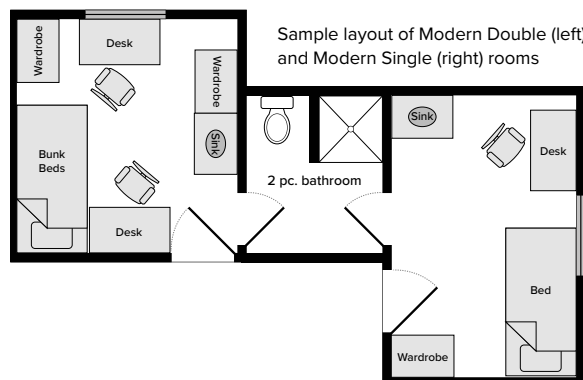
