Conditional admissions process	Students will have to submit their transcript and application fee and will receive a decision in 3-5 business days.
IB credit information	Transfer credit will be awarded for a maximum of 30 credit hours if students receive grades of 5,6, or 7 on individual higher-level IB subjects. Information on this

AP credit information	Students are eligible to receive transfer credit for a total of 18 credit hours on individual subjects where students received grades of 4 or 5 on the AP exam. Information on this can be located here .
Policy on repeated courses	If a student takes a course more than once, we will accept the higher mark.
Policy on summer school, night school, online courses, and correspondence courses	So long as students present the completion of the high school level course and it is a course that we accept, we will be able to use any summer school, night school, and online courses.
Treatment of out-of-province high school courses from schools such as Blyth or MEI	We would look at the admissions requirements from the province the student is taking the course from.
Application deadline	We have rolling admission – applications will be considered until August 2022, but students are recommended to apply by February 1, 2022 to ensure they are able to receive an admission decision prior to the scholarship deadline on March 1, 2022.
Application fee	There is a \$55 application fee.
Timing of offers/grades used	It would take 3-5 business days after we have received all of the application documents to get back to a student with the decision.
Deferral policy	Students can defer for a semester or a full academic year. If they wish to defer, they should contact admissions@stu.ca and we will advise on the steps they need to take.

Decision criteria	In selecting major entrance scholarship recipients, the primary criterion is the academic record. The Entrance Scholarship Committee considers admission average, grade 12 program (courses and level of difficulty), rank in graduating class and program and performance in grade 11. Other factors considered include: letters of academic reference and scores on standardized tests (if applicable). Leadership qualities extracurricular activities and financial need are considered in awarding some entrance scholarships.
Guaranteed scholarship program	We do not offer guaranteed scholarships. Students are encouraged to apply for Scholarships through our online application upon acceptance to the university. The deadline for this is March 1 st , 2022.

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NEW INSTITUTION UPDATES/HIGHLIGHTS

Currently, our Vanier Hall residence building is undergoing renovations and will be ready in November 2021. Vanier Hall will be co-ed and hallway wings will be mixed gender.

Our Bachelor of Social Work program was restructured, so it now is a four-year program. Interested students apply to and complete two years of Bachelor of Arts coursework at St. Thomas, during which they can complete the necessary prerequisite social work courses. Then, at the end of the first two years, they are eligible to apply for admission to our Bachelor of Social Work program, which is an additional two years. In total, students study for four years and graduate with a BSW, being qualified to become registered social workers.

St. Thomas University also now offers a one-year, full-time Masters of Social Work program, which is professional-based. The application deadline is November 15th.
