International Baccalaureate (IB)

The University of Regina recognizes the success and achievements of students who have completed the IB program. The IB challenges students to excel in their studies and encourages both personal and academic achievement and the U of R recognizes completion of the IB diploma as evidence of satisfactory secondary standing. Applicants with this credential must still meet faculty-specific course admission requirements and other requirements of their chosen faculty.

Transfer Credits

The University of Regina recognizes the Higher Level IB courses (listed on the back) for the corresponding transfer credits. A grade of 5 or better must be achieved in the course to be considered for transfer credit. Students must request an official transcript from the IB to be sent directly to the University of Regina Enrolment Services Office.

Supporting Academic Excellence

There are many supports available to assist students in maintaining their high level of achievement as they work on their university studies. From the that time students are considering program options until they successfully complete a degree, our student services are here to help in all areas of student life.

Scholarships & Awards

Our Application Required Entrance Awards consider other factors including extracurricular involvement, financial need, planned program of study, and/or academic and personal references.

Requesting IB Transcripts

The IB provides an official transcript of grades for the Diploma Programme (DP) as the official copy of your IB results. It includes your personal student information along with the subjects you were registered for, and the grades achieved for each subject. For DP students, it also indicates the overall Diploma result. Once requested, these transcripts are sent directly to the institution indicated in the request.
