Home to more than 50 per cent of our students, the School of Arts and Social Science offers undergraduate degree programs in:

ENGLISH (BA)

This program investigates diverse genres, periods and theoretical approaches in concentrations of Canadian literature, dramatic literature, modern literature or a combination. Explore classical and contemporary works – Medieval epics to graphic novels – and get first-hand experience in creative writing and publishing. grenfell.mun.ca/english

HISTORICAL STUDIES (BA)

History is the legacy that shapes today's ideas and beliefs, technologies, culture, natural and human environments, socio-economic systems, and quest for freedom and human rights. Dedicated and experienced faculty will help you understand and organize detailed information, think critically, refine writing and communication skills, and use your imagination to develop and apply original ideas. grenfell.mun.ca/historical-studies

MULTIDISCIPLINARY HUMANITIES (BA)

This program is all about seeing beyond the status quo and taking an active role in society. You'll delve into the minds of the greatest ancient, modern and Indigenous thinkers. PSYCHOLOGY (BA, BA (HONS.), B.SC., B.SC. (HONS))

From cyberbullying and mental health to social media and personalities, this program will help

you understand individual and group behaviours. Courses include abnormal psychology, cognitive neuroscience, sexual behaviour, sensation and perception, and forensic psychology. grenfell.mun.ca/psychology

SOCIAL/CULTURAL STUDIES (BA)

The program uses anthropology, ethnohistory, folklore and sociology to examine the human race both individually and collectively, encompassing a wide range of approaches, methods and perspectives. You'll work with faculty who research topics like Indigenous identity, women's issues and the relationship between power and knowledge. grenfell.mun.ca/social-cultural-studies

BUSINESS (BBA, BBA (HONS))

Explores the core areas of business, plus special interest areas such as personal finance, social media, recruitment and consumer behaviour. SCHOOL OF FINE ARTS

We are the cornerstone of creativity on campus, contributing to the vibrancy of Grenfell and the city. We have the distinction of offering the only degree in visual arts and theatre in the province. Our graduates have gone on to find thriving careers in the worlds of visual and performing arts, theatre, film and television. Our faculty are professional artists working in a variety of genres and media that demonstrate both their passion and expertise. Our facilities include an art gallery, theatre, printshop, studios, rehearsal hall, wardrobe and prop areas, and a Fab Shop.

The School of Fine Arts offers undergraduate degree programs in:

THEATRE (BFA)

Students in the acting stream develop fundamental skills including voice, movement and speech. You'll learn how to apply these skills to scene study, technique and live performance. Students in the technical theatre production stream master the key skills of theatre production, including lighting, sound, wardrobe, props, carpentry, drafting, scenic painting and stage management. You'll study at our campus in Harlow, UK, watching plays and training with professional actors and technicians that work there. It's competitive. Students will have to audition for acting and interview for technical theatre. Deadline is Feb.1. grenfell.mun.ca/theatre

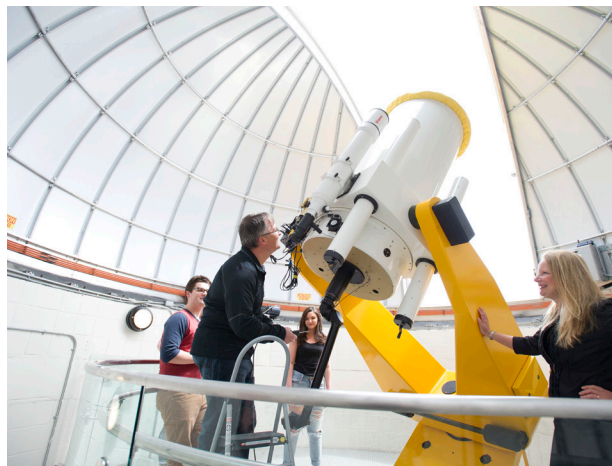
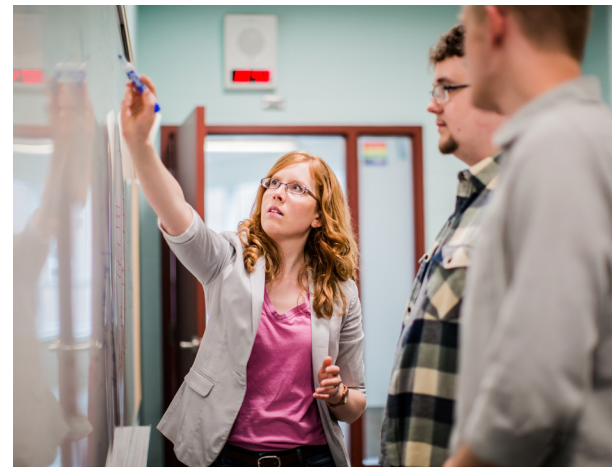
VISUAL ARTS (BFA)

The program's studio courses include computers and art, drawing, painting, photography, print-making, sculpture, textile/fibre art and time-based media. Art history/visual culture courses and a health and safety component will give you a solid grounding in visual arts. You will also make self-directed work and learn from visual arts faculty and technicians who are practicing artists. In your graduating exhibition, you will showcase your independent art production at the Grenfell Art Gallery. It's competitive. Students will need to submit a portfolio. Deadline is Feb. 1.

SCHOOL OF SCIENCE AND THE ENVIRONMENT

School of Science and the Environment students enjoy small classes, flexible programs, hands-on research and community engagement, and a tradition of outstanding undergraduate and graduate experience. Our faculty and staff are dedicated to excellence in teaching, research, and community engagement in a diverse set of disciplines within science and related to the environment.

Home to both natural science and social science, the School of Science and the Environment offers undergraduate degree programs in:

COMPUTATIONAL MATHEMATICS (B.SC.)

Mathematics is the language of the future. This program will challenge you to explore algorithms, calculations and logical reasoning. You will take courses in differential equations, numerical analysis, applied graph theory, statistics, vector calculus, logical reasoning and algorithms and complexity. grenfell.mun.ca/math

ENVIRONMENTAL SCIENCE (B.SC., B.SC. (HONS))

In the biology stream, study the ecology of organisms in freshwater and terrestrial environments and cultivation of tissue culture and microbiological preparation in our laboratories. In the chemistry stream, study the impact of chemical pesticides or atmospheric pollutants. The chemistry lab focuses on the study of organic and inorganic chemistry and the study of carbon-based and metallic compounds. grenfell.mun.ca/environmental-science

ENVIRONMENT AND SUSTAINABILITY

[BES (ENVIRONMENTAL STUDIES, RESOURCE MANAGEMENT)]

The Bachelor of Environment and Sustainability (BES) program bridges scientific concerns about natural resources with policy development and management. The four-year degree program offers two majors, one in Environmental Studies and one in Resource Management. The BES equips students with the tools and critical thinking skills necessary to make decisions

regarding how we use the environment now with a view to future generations.

GENERAL SCIENCE (B.SC.)

This program is different than most because it recognizes the scientific foundation that comes from a triple concentration; this makes our graduates well prepared for employment requiring breadth of knowledge. You'll study many topics – everything from genetics and paleontology to the solar system. You'll be led in classrooms by academics from diverse backgrounds and areas of expertise. You'll get to choose three concentrations from biology, chemistry, earth systems, mathematics and physics. grenfell.mun.ca/science

PHYSICS (B.SC.)

This program allows you to design and implement your own experiments. Explore everything from the smallest nucleus to the farthest galaxies through Newfoundland's only professional telescope and be trained in modern data-analysis techniques and state-of-the-art numerical and symbolic computing methods. grenfell.mun.ca/physics

In addition to meeting the general university admission requirements, you must also have completed high school biology and chemistry. Deadline: January 20, 2023.

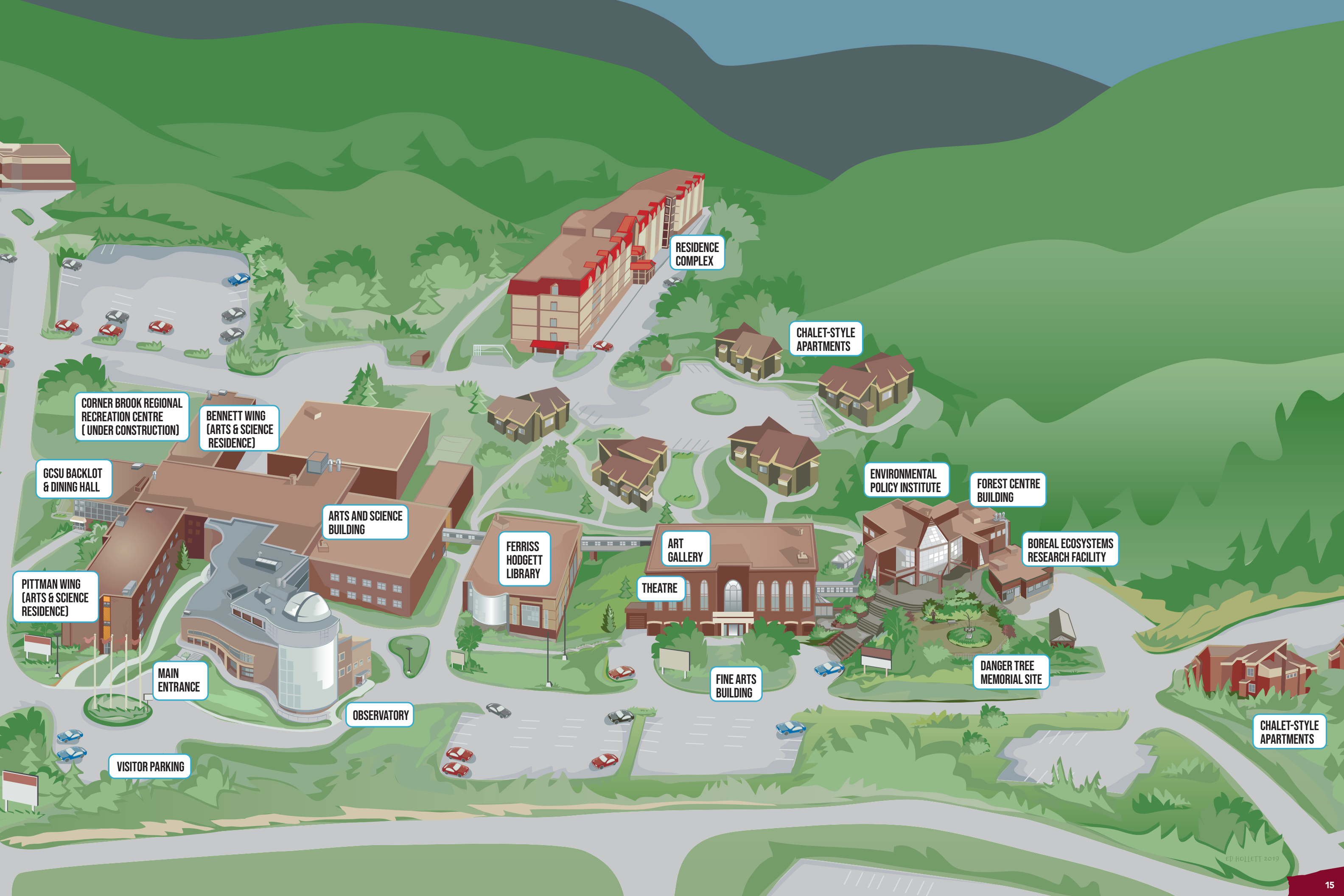

The basic undergraduate application should include the following items:

- Grenfell undergraduate application for admission/readmission
- Non-refundable application fee (\$60 CAD for Canadian high school students; \$120 for Canadian students transferring from institutions outside of Newfoundland and Labrador; \$120 for International students). Review the specific admission requirements for your region and check the relevant deadline for filing your application.

SUPPORTING DOCUMENTS

Identify and collect supporting documents. Be sure to check and see if your program of choice requires additional application materials.



If you are a current high school student from Newfoundland and Labrador, your final grades will be sent automatically. Otherwise, you will need to have your official transcripts sent to our admissions office.

HOUSING

Apply for on-campus housing. First-year undergraduate students are guaranteed a room on-campus if you apply by the March 1 deadline (some conditions apply). Apply online and pay the \$20 application fee. grenfell.mun.ca/housing

ADMISSIONS

If you are applying from a Canadian high school, you must complete the Grade 12 university preparatory program with a passing grade in each of the following subjects: English, mathematics, a laboratory science, a social science or modern or classical language, and an elective. You must have an overall average of 70 per cent within the Grade 12 subject areas noted below. If you are missing any of these requirements or have any questions please contact the Registrar’s Office at info@grenfell.mun.ca. Some specific programs may have additional requirements.

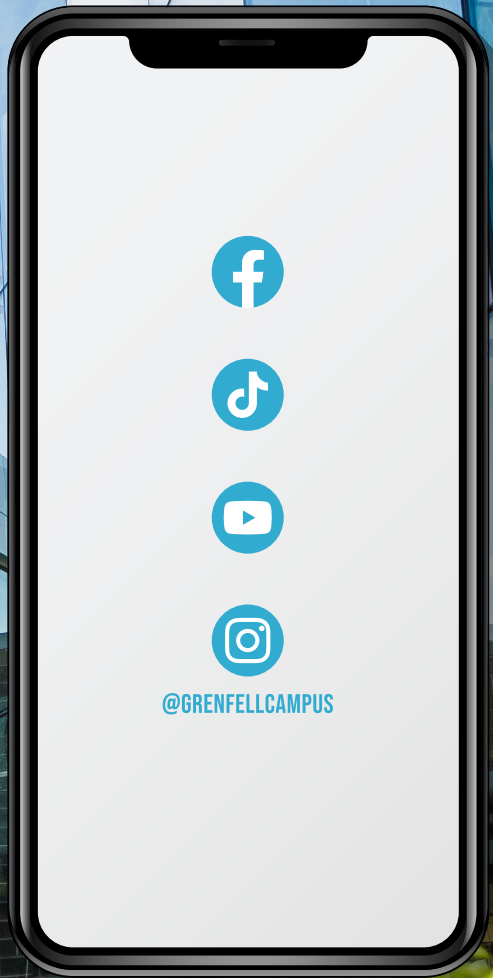
